Day 1:

- 8.30 9.00 Am. Pick up from Ching Mai Airport / Hotel
- 9.30 -11.30 Am. Discover Local Life at "Ban Muang Kung" Village + Pottery Workshop
- 12.00 1.00 Pm. Lunch
- 1.40 2.30 Pm. Visit Wat Ton Kwen & Dress in Traditional Thai Costume Step back in time and experience the grace of Thai culture at Wat Ton Kwen — one of the few remaining Lanna-style wooden temples, rich in history and intricate craftsmanship
- 2.40 3.30 Pm. Journey to Ban Kad Village, Mae Wang Discover Traditional Weaving & the Art of Making Saa
 Paper Umbrellas
- Take a scenic drive to Ban Kad Village in Mae Wang District a peaceful community rich in cultural heritage and craftsmanship.
- 4.00 Pm. Travel to the Elephant Camp Accommodation

- 9.00 11.00 Pm. Am. Prepare food for the elephants by cutting sugarcane/greases
- 12.00 1.00 Pm. Lunch
- 1.00 1.40 Pm. Chang clothes Make herbal balls for the elephant and feed them.
- 1.40 2.30 Pm. Take a mud spa with the elephants
- 2.30 3.00 Pm. Bathe and brush the elephants
- 3.15 3.40 Pm. Visit Mae wang waterfall
- 4.00 Take a shower and change clothes
- 6.00 Dinner and resting time.

Day 3:

- 8.30 Am. Breakfast
- 9.30 11.30 Pm. Learn to Eco printing (Free T-Shirt) Natural Dyeing with Leaves, Flowers & Nature's Gifts.
- This is a traditional dyeing technique that uses leaves, flowers, and other natural materials to create patterns and colors on fabric all without harmful chemical.
- 11.30 12.40 Pm. Walk to Mae Mood Waterfall, Have a fun cooking class hill-tribe style and lunch
- 1.40 2.30 Pm. Return to elephant camp
- 3.00 -5.00 Pm. From Waste to Wonder: Elephant Dung Turns into Flower Pots!
- An elephant eats over 200 kilograms of food per day that's more than 10 tons of grass every week!
- Naturally, this results in 5–6 tons of dung daily. Instead of letting it go to waste, we clean, dry, and transform the dung into eco-friendly flowerpots.
- These handmade pots not only support sustainability, but they also retain nutrients allowing us to reuse the natural fertilizer to help flowers grow beautifully.

Day 4:

- 8.30 Am. Breakfast
- 9.30 -11.30 Pm. Travel to Wat Luang Khun Win is over 700 years old, making it one of the most historically significant and ancient temples in the region. The entire temple is crafted from wood, intricately carved with traditional Lanna designs. Highlights include the ordination hall with a standing Buddha in the walking meditation pose, a reclining Buddha hall representing the Lord's final Nirvana, and a gracefully designed Naga staircase. The temple is nestled deep in lush forest, offering a tranquil and peaceful atmosphere. There is no electricity within the temple grounds all power comes from solar energy, preserving the temple's harmony with nature.
- 11.30 12.30. Pm. Return to elephant camp and lunch
- 1.00 -2.30 Pm. Learn How to Make Traditional Thai Sticky Rice Parcels (Khao Tom) Experience the charm of Thai culinary heritage by learning to make Khao Tom traditional sticky rice parcels wrapped in banana leaves.

You'll learn the authentic way to:

- 1. Prepare sticky rice mixed with coconut milk
- 2. Add fillings like banana or black beans
- 3. Wrap them beautifully in banana leaves
- 4. Steam them the traditional way over a wood fire
- 6.00 Pm. Dinner and resting time

Day 5

- 8.30 Am. Breakfast.
- 9.30 12.00 Pm. Trek 3-4 km through the scenic Mae Wang National Park area. Immerse yourself in the tranquil nature and landscapes. Observe local wildlife in their natural habitats. Students will engage with the natural environment on a deeper level, learning about the region's unique biodiversity, including its rich variety of plant life and bird species.
- 12.00 12.30. Pm. Return to elephant camp
- 12.30 1.30 Pm. Lunch
- 1.30 3.00 Connect with majestic Thai buffalos. Learn about and participate in traditional Thai farming practices. The water buffalo, often called the "royal worker," has a long and storied history as the backbone of Thai rice farming. This activity allows students to interact with these gentle giants and learn about their vital role in the rural economy.
- 4.00 Take a shower and change clothes
- 6.00 Dinner and resting time.







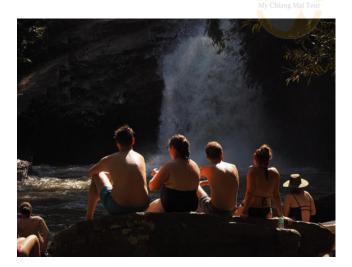






Day 6:

- 8.30 Am. Breakfast.
- 9.30 12.00 Pm. Enjoy a walk around the hill-tribe village and visit waterfalls.
- This activity serves as a final, intimate exploration of the local community. It is a moment for students to apply their cultural knowledge gained throughout the week in a real-world setting.
- 12.00 12.30. Pm. Return to elephant camp
- 12.30 1.30 Pm. Lunch
- 1.30 2.00 Pm. Pack Up & Get Ready to Return to Chiang Mai City
- 2.30 3.00 Pm. Say goodbye to the elephant and Mahouts. This final interaction reinforces the camp's commitment to ethical tourism and the importance of compassionate animal care.
- 3.00 3.40 Pm. Enjoy Bamboo rafting. The bamboo rafting trip is a symbolic and serene conclusion to the camp. Beyond being a traditional and eco-friendly form of transport, it serves as a final, shared experience that promotes collaboration and reflection.
- 4.00 Pm. Go back to Hotel.
